Changes for Candidates

- No nominating petition process
- All general election candidates must participate in the primary (unless a qualified write-in)
- No (prior) party or group registration needed
- Candidate chooses their affiliation that appears on the ballot (voter registration may be updated)
- Governor / Lieutenant Governor file together

Ranked Choice Voting

Ballots are counted in rounds. If a candidate gets 50%
+ 1 vote in the first round, they win.

 You rank candidates in order of preference instead of only choosing one



The candidate with the most votes wins.




Tabulation Process
